

In Lyndsey's 8+ years at Luna Park Sydney, she has fulfilled a number of roles within the organisation gaining experience in all Park operations roles, WH&S, Events and Duty Managing which required overseeing daily operations of the site simultaneously including the Amusement Park and up to 4 separate events per day.

As part of the executive Leadership Team reporting to the CEO, Lyndsey is an active participant in the strategic direction and shaping the next chapter of the business.

Mel Goodman is the Head of Events & Venue Operations at Sydney Showground. A world-class venue, Sydney Showground delivers over 100 national and international events each year, including music festivals, sporting events, exhibitions and tradeshows. Sydney Showground has partnerships with the Australian Football League and Cricket NSW, with the Greater Western Sydney GIANTS and Sydney Thunder utilising ENGIE Stadium for their home-ground matches. Every year, Sydney Showground hosts the iconic Sydney Royal Easter Show. Australia's largest annual ticketed event, the show attracts circa 900,000 people.

Mel has worked in the events industry for over 15 years and since 2021 has been the Head of Events & Venue Operations for Sydney Showground. Mel's event delivery is extensive, having overseen all facets of event and venue operations for recent major events such as Laneway Festival, ICC T20 Women's World Cup and Knockout Outdoor as well as a raft of concerts, dance parties, exhibitions and conferences. Mel also headed Venue Operations for the FIFA Women's World Cup 2023 International Broadcast Centre.

Topic: Engage and engage early! Operational readiness in lead up to major sporting events.

Chris Zammit is a security, resilience and risk specialist with a particular focus on stadia and venue planning, security operations, emergency planning and response underpinned with a sound risk management approach.

He has worked with a vast range of sporting bodies in Australia and internationally including the National Hockey League (NHL), Fédération Internationale de Basketball (FIBA), World Aquatics (formerly FINA), World Athletics, Basketball Australia, Football Federation Australia (FFA), Cricket Australia and the Australia Football League (AFL), as well as several high profile teams such as Manchester United, Arsenal, Tottenham Hotspur, Newcastle United, Los Angeles Kings, Arizona Coyotes and the USA Basketball Team.

Prior to joining Sheridan Consulting Group, Chris led the security function at the Australian Football League (AFL) for almost four years where he managed the national emergency planning and response, protective security of AFL staff, club personnel, players, officials and spectators. Mike is a career red team operator who spent years thinking like an adversary, using physical and digital methods to infiltrate buildings and networks. Mike has presented on drone threat proliferation at the United Nations, NATO and to the US National Security Council at The White House.

DroneSec was founded in 2016 as an intelligence-led approach to the counterdrone problem and serves FVEY military, government and law enforcement. It provides awareness of emerging UAS tactics, techniques and procedures (TTPs) in the rapidly scaling small drone threat environment. DroneSec intelligence has discovered and helped prevent hostile drone attacks against stadiums and major sporting events.
